

Conflict Minerals

U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission rules require certain companies to disclose the extent to which the products they manufacture or contract to manufacture contain so-called conflict minerals sourced from mines in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or adjoining countries. Conflict minerals include tantalum, tin, tungsten, and gold, which are used in many electronic components and computer products.

Alpha 3 Manufacturing Limited (together with its subsidiaries and affiliates “Alpha 3”) firmly believes that its customers should be fully informed about the products they purchase. Alpha 3 is committed to working with its customers to supply products that meet the customer's specifications.

Alpha 3 does not directly purchase any conflict minerals from any source and endeavors not to purchase products that contain conflict minerals that directly or indirectly finance, or benefit armed groups in the DRC or adjoining countries. Alpha 3 expects its suppliers to source minerals from responsible sources and provide Alpha 3 with proper verification of the country of origin and source of the materials used in the products they supply to it.

Alpha 3 fully understands the importance of this issue to its customers and is committed to working towards a conflict-free supply chain. Alpha 3 encourages all of its suppliers to likewise support these efforts and make information on the origin of their product components easily accessible on their websites.

If Alpha 3 becomes aware of any products supplied to it that contain conflict minerals sourced from mines in the DRC or adjoining countries it will immediately take appropriate action to resource supply of these materials.
